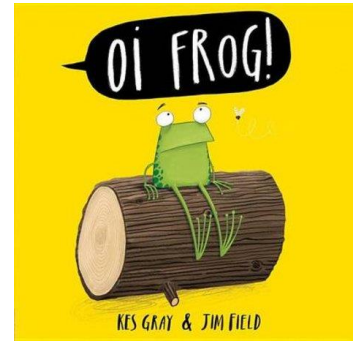


Oi frog!

- Talk with your child about other words that sound similar but not the same (rhyming words). Try and find or make up a word that rhymes with your own name for example 'chilly lilly' 'lucy goosey' 'slow joe'
- On your daily walk have a look around for different animals and try to practice rhyming words with whichever animal you can see, these can be made up words or real words, sometimes they sound really funny!

- When playing outside, ask your grown up for some mud/sand/sticks/grass and mix it all up into a squelchy mud pie, you could pretend to make a bog for a frog! You could even use your toy animals to play in the mud. You could have a frog on a log in a bog!



- Ask your grown up to have a look on the internet for facts about frogs. You could learn about different species of frogs, what they like to eat, where in the world they live and how they are different.

- Did you know that some frogs like to sit on lily pads? Make a lily pad out of a paper plate. You could colour it in, stick on tissue paper or use whatever craft resources you have at home. See if you can make it float in your bath or padding pool at home (careful it might sink and go very soggy). You could have a look at different objects too and see if they sink or float in the water
